When, a few years ago, the New Industrial Policy of Cyprus was announced, very few persons in the country realized the magnitude of the endeavour and the need for sustained and concerted effort.





One of the tools which is used to implement the policy is that of incubators for technology based businesses focusing on new innovative ideas.



The path from a good idea to a successful enterprise is very long.





In the chain from Idea to Realization. Incubators are designed to form the link between the four key elements for success:

- An innovative idea with market potential
- The ability to penetrate into the market
- Success in exciting the financiers
- The ability to manage the project



The role of the incubators is to create and fuse the necessary links amongst persons getting together for the purpose of exploiting an idea's potential.





The effort which is needed can be compared to an iceberg and the first success of an incubator is to convince the inventor that he/she has to give before he/she can take.

- A. As physical establishments operating:
 - ✓ as independent entities
 - \checkmark as parts of other institutions
 - ✓ as single, integrated units
 - ✓ as disperse units





- B. As supporting partners providing:
 - ✓ consulting
 - ✓ services
 - ✓ resources
 - ✓ networking
 - ✓ finance

Our effort in Cyprus has met with several difficulties which are being slowly overcome:

- a) Unfamiliarity with the requirements of the new institution which is being created.
- b) Inability to grasp the need for speedy decisions and action by some of those concerned on the government side
- c) Weaknesses in the staffing of the Ministry
- d) A form of control incompatible with the risk-prone nature of each undertaking
- e) Unpredictability of the continuity in the flow of funds



What is needed is to find ways to implement greater flexibility.

This is recognized by all as a key success issue in this cooperation between Government and Private Sector Initiative.
